About The CPSIA

President Bush signed the Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act of 2008 (H.R. 4040) into law August 14, 2008. The CPSIA was passed to protect children from unsafe toys after the widely publicized recalls of 2007 which shook the public's trust. **However, the CPSIA does not just encompass toys. It regulates ALL products for children under 12 years of age. Clothing, cloth diapers, car seats, books, bicycles, jewelry, electronic products, blankets, sheets, bibs, strollers—EVERYTHING.**

This legislation, while well intentioned, has unintended consequences that threaten the children's resale industry. Large portions of inventory that were safe and legal to sell on February 9th will be defined as "banned hazardous substances" overnight—regardless of whether these products contain dangerous materials.

FAQ's

Is it true that the CPSC Press Release issued on January 30 solved the problem for resale & thrift shops?

This CPSC action provides no relief for the resale industry. Nothing has changed. Testing and certification requirements have never applied to the secondary market.

Is it true that the CPSC Press Release issued on January 8 was an exempted resale & thrift shops from the law?

NO! The law remains UNALTERED! Please read it VERY CAREFULLY! This is NOT a ruling, exemption or exception to the CPSIA... it is a Press Release. It is NOT definitive! It is a step in the right direction toward open communication, however nothing has changed. We have ALWAYS fully understood that manufacturers are required to test for lead, not resellers, but how is a store to know definitively if a product violates the lead requirements unless it tests. Those resellers that do sell products in violation of the new limits could face civil and/or criminal penalties. Quite a dilemma! We need your help now more than ever!
